### Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

## General Education Requirements

Three options are available to students who plan to complete their General Education requirements at College of DuPage.

- **Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree:** Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General Education requirements. Students who transfer with an Associate of Science degree granted December 2016 or later may need to take one additional Humanities course and one additional Social and Behavioral Sciences course to meet Northeastern's General Education requirements.
- **Completion of the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI):** Students who transfer after completing the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) will have met their General Education requirements.

- \*Students who are awarded AP credit for PSYCH 1100 at the College of DuPage must have earned a score of '4' or '5' in order to receive credit for PSYC 200 at Northeastern. Students with a score of '3' on the AP test will still need to complete PSYCH 1100 at COD with a grade of "C" or better in order to meet the major requirement at Northeastern.
- All College of DuPage students must complete one course in each of the following areas as part of their associate's degree: Human Relations, Global/Multicultural Studies, and Contemporary Life Skills. See your College of DuPage advisor for course options.
- All students who earn an Associate of Arts Degree from College of DuPage enter Northeastern with 64 hours of transfer credit. See the [NEIU Transfer Policy](#) for further information.
- Students have the option of completing a minor course of study along with their major in Psychology. Minor courses of study at Northeastern are 18-21 credit hours and can be completed in place of general electives without adding additional semesters or credit hours to a student's graduation plan.
