Justice Studies Program Description

The Justice Studies department also offers minors in Social Justice, Criminology and Child Advocacy Studies. These minor programs are optional and could be taken as a complement to any major at Northeastern.

Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

General Education Requirements

Three options are available to students who plan to complete their General Education requirements at City Colleges of Chicago.

- Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree: Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General Education requirements. Students who transfer with an Associate of Science degree granted December 2016 or later may need to take one additional Humanities course and one additional Social and Behavioral Sciences course to meet Northeastern's General Education requirements.
- **Completion of the** *Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI):* Students who transfer after completing the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) will have met their General Education requirements.
- Transfer Course Lists for City Colleges of Chicago: Students may choose to meet their General Education requirements by selecting courses from Northeastern's <u>Transfer Course Equivalency Guides</u>.  Criminal Law & Procedure are directly equivalent to JUST elective courses at NEIU. For maximum transferability,
 CCC students should take three of these courses at City Colleges of Chicago.
- All City Colleges of Chicago students must complete a course in Human Diversity as part of their associate's degree. See your City Colleges of Chicago advisor for course options.
- All students who earn an Associate of Arts Degree from City Colleges of Chicago enter Northeastern with 64 hours of transfer credit, even if they earned less than 64 credit hours. See the <u>NEIU Transfer Policy</u> for further information.
- Students have the option of completing a minor course of study along with their major in Art. Minor courses of study at Northeastern are 18-21 credit hours and can be completed in place of general electives without adding additional semesters or credit hours to a student's graduation plan.
