Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

General Education Requirements

Three options are available to students who plan to complete their General Education requirements at Oakton Community College.

- Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree: Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community
 College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General
 Education requirements. Students who transfer with an Associate of Science degree granted December 2016 or
 later may need to take one additional Humanities course and one additional Social and Behavioral Sciences course
 to meet Northeastern's General Education requirements.
- Completion of the *Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI):* Students who transfer after completing the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) will have met their General Education requirements.

- All Oakton Community College students must complete one course to fulfill the U. S. Diversity requirement and one course to fulfill the Global Diversity requirement as part of their associate's degree. See your Oakton Community College advisor for course options.
- The Economics department recommends students complete MAT 143 Finite Mathematics since this is a prerequisite for many Economics major courses.
- All students who earn an Associate of Arts Degree from Oakton Community College enter Northeastern with 64 hours of transfer credit, even if they earned less than 64 credit hours. See the <u>NEIU Transfer Policy</u> for further information.
- Students have the option of completing a minor course of study along with their major in Economics. Minor courses of study at Northeastern are 18-21 credit hours and can be completed in place of general electives without adding additional semesters or credit hours to a student's graduation plan.
