### Psychology Program Description

The interdisciplinary nature of psychology requires familiarity with other fields. Students intending to pursue graduate studies should have a strong background in mathematics and the natural sciences. All Psychology majors will benefit from course work in philosophy, physiology, literature, history, the social sciences, and computer science.

### Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

- Application deadlines are as follows:

## General Education Requirements

Three options are available to students who plan to complete their General Education requirements at South Suburban College.

- **Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree:** Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General Education requirements. Students who transfer with an Associate of Science degree granted December 2016 or later may need to take one additional Humanities course and one additional Social and Behavioral Sciences course to meet Northeastern's General Education requirements.
- **Completion of the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI):** Students who transfer after completing the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) will have met their General Education requirements.

**Notes:**

- \*Students who are awarded AP credit for PSY 101 at South Suburban must have earned a score of '4' or '5' in order to receive credit for PSYC 200 at Northeastern. Students with a score of '3' on the AP test will still need to complete PSY 101 at South Suburban with a grade of "C" or better in order to meet the major requirement at Northeastern.
- All South Suburban College students must complete the Non-Western or Third-World Culture requirement as part of their associate's degree. See your South Suburban College advisor for course options.
- All students who earn an Associate of Arts Degree from South Suburban College enter Northeastern with 64 hours of transfer credit, even if they have earned fewer than 64 credit hours. See the [NEIU Transfer Policy](#) for further information.
- Students have the option of completing a minor course of study along with their major in Psychology. Minor courses of study at Northeastern are 18-21 credit hours and can be completed in place of general electives without adding additional semesters or credit hours to a student's graduation plan.
