# Early Childhood Education (Non-Licensure Track) Program Description

This concentration is designed as a non-licensure track for students pursuing the Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Education. This concentration prepares students to graduate with knowledge, skills, and dispositions needed to work with children from birth to Grade 2 in a variety of settings which do not require a teaching license. Such settings include museums, child care programs, non-profit organizations, private schools/businesses, and other places which provide conducive environments for young children to engage in active learning as they grow and develop.

Students can enter the program with AA or AAS, or as Freshmen. After the completion of 60 credit hours, all undergraduates will be able to proceed with taking courses if they have the following:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- No grades below a C
- Successfully completed (with a C grade minimum) English 101 and 102 and college level Math

### **Admission Requirements**

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.
