## **Sociology Program Description**

Northeastern's Department of Sociology offers courses leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree in sociology. Additionally, students may choose an eighteen-hour minor in sociology.

Sociology is the systematic study of human societies, their patterns and arrangements, their processes of development and change. Course offerings cover sociological theories, research methods, gender and sexuality, race and ethnicity, inequalities, social institutions, social issues, social action and social change.

A major in sociology can provide a useful orientation for students who plan to attend graduate school or seek careers in community-based organizations or in such fields as education, human resources, urban planning, law, community organizing, social welfare, or research in government and private organizations.

## **Admission Requirements**

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

## **General Education Requirements**

Three options are available to students who plan to complete their General Education requirements at City Colleges of Chicago.

- Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree: Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community
  College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General
  Education requirements. Students who transfer with an Associate of Science degree granted December 2016 or
  later may need to take one additional Humanities course and one additional Social and Behavioral Sciences course
  to meet Northeastern's General Education requirements.
- Completion of the *Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI):* Students who transfer after completing the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) will have met their General Education requirements.

- All City Colleges of Chicago students must complete the Human Diversity requirement as part of their associate's degree. See your City Colleges of Chicago advisor for course options.
- \*\*All City Colleges of Chicago students must complete two courses in a world language or demonstrate competency equivalent to the stated outcomes of a second semester course.
- All students who earn an Associate of Arts Degree from City Colleges of Chicago enter Northeastern with 64 hours
  of transfer credit, even if they have earned fewer than 64 credit hours. See the <a href="NEIU Transfer Policy">NEIU Transfer Policy</a> for further
  information.
- Students have the option of completing a minor course of study along with their major in Sociology. Minor courses of study at Northeastern are 18-21 credit hours and can be completed in place of general electives without adding additional semesters or credit hours to a student's graduation plan.
