Art (Studio Art Concentration) Program Description

Northeastern's Department of Art + Design offers an undergraduate program leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree in Art. The fundamental objective of the Art + Design Department programs is to provide and promote a knowledge and understanding of the visual arts. The studio concentration gives students hands-on exposure to a variety of skills, both analytic and technical, in order to help students express concepts visually. Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

General Education Requirements

Three options are available to students who plan to complete their General Education requirements at South Suburban College.

- **Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree:** Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General Education requirements. Students who transfer with an Associate of Science degree granted December 2016 or later may need to take one additional Humanities course and one additional Social and Behavioral Sciences course to meet Northeastern's General Education requirements.
- **Completion of the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI):** Students who transfer after completing the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) will have met their General Education requirements.
