Community Health Program Description

The Community Health (HSCI) program prepares students to work in a variety of settings that include: city, county, and state health departments, hospitals, worksite wellness, college campuses, parks and recreation departments, non-profit organizations (American Diabetes Association, American Cancer Society, YMCA, Boys and Girls Club), and more. Example programs community health majors work with include: nutrition and exercise, alcohol and other drugs, sexual transmitted infections and contraception awareness, social and emotional health, environmental awareness, disease prevention, health disparities, immunization awareness, and many more. They may initiate wellness programs, write policies, implement educational activities, or create resources to promote healthy living. Examples of job titles might include, but are not limited to, healthcare administrator, health educator, and community health worker. The degree is also a launching pad for a graduate education in a number of health-related fields.

Northeastern Illinois University Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

General Education Requirements

- All students who earn an Associate of Arts Degree from City Colleges of Chicago enter Northeastern with 64 hours • of transfer credit, even if they earned less than 64 credit hours. See the NEIU Transfer Policy for further information.
- *Community Health major students will need to choose between a Public Health Sciences or Exercise Science and Recreation concentration. Students who choose Public Health Sciences may complete AFRO AM 101 Introduction to African American Studies, HUM 143 Introduction to Latin American/Latino Studies, and HUM 146 Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender as their Humanities or Fine Arts courses toward their associate degree and as major electives toward the Community Health major with a concentration in Public Health Sciences.
- **Community Health major students can also choose a concentration of an accelerated Bachelor of Science/Master of Public Health program. Students choosing this option should follow the Humanities/Fine Arts course suggestions from the above bullet point.
