Justice Studies Program Description

The Bachelor of Arts degree in Justice Studies prepares students for human and social service work, research or advocacy positions, law school or graduate school. Criminal justice practitioners who wish to develop a comprehensive understanding of social justice and social policy will find the program well suited to their needs. The Justice Studies department also offers minors in Social Justice, Criminology and Child Advocacy Studies. These minor programs are optional and could be taken as a complement to any major at Northeastern.

Admission Requirements

- Students must have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college or university course work attempted. Students must be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Required documents are: application for admission, \$30 nonrefundable application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities.

General Education Requirements

Three options are available to students who plan to complete their General Education requirements at City Colleges of Chicago.

- **Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree:** Students who transfer with an approved Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) Model Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have met Northeastern Illinois University's General Education requirements. - *Students can transfer up to three courses into the Justice Studies program at NEIU. CRM JUS 102 Administration of Criminal Justice, CRM JUS 104 Street Law, CRM JUS 114 Administration of Juvenile Justice, and CRM JUS 234 Criminal Law & Procedure are directly equivalent to JUST elective courses at NEIU. For maximum transferability, CCC students should take three of these courses at City Colleges of Chicago.
- All City Colleges of Chicago students must complete a course in Human Diversity as part of their associate's degree. See your City Colleges of Chicago advisor for course options.
- All students who earn an Associate of Arts Degree from City Colleges of Chicago enter Northeastern with 64 hours of transfer credit, even if they earned less than 64 credit hours. See the [NEIU Transfer Policy](#) for further information.
- Students have the option of completing a minor course of study along with their major in Art. Minor courses of study at Northeastern are 18-21 credit hours and can be completed in place of general electives without adding additional semesters or credit hours to a student's graduation plan.
